

Current Job Posting Trends¹

Wolverhampton Overview

- Between April to June 2025 (inclusive), there were 8,319 unique job adverts for roles recorded in Wolverhampton. This number of postings is high compared to all local authority districts. Over the past year, this has decreased by 20.6%, compared to a decrease of 2.3% across the UK.
- During this period, there were 6,109 unique job postings. This number of postings is high compared to all local authority districts. Over the past year, this has decreased by 22.7%, compared to a decrease of 2.5% across the UK.

Demand and Interest Trend:



- Comparing the final week of the quarter with the same week at the start of the quarter, live
 postings adverts were unchanged while new job postings decreased by 10.3%, indicating a decline
 in labour market demand.
- More recent trends show an increase in demand as live postings increased by 12.8% in the last 30 days of job posting activity, new postings also increased by 10.6% showing a strong recovery in labour market demand following a decline at the start of the quarter.
- By comparing interest quotient and demand, we can identify where there are mismatches in talent/supply and demand. Interest Quotient is ranked high at 2.5.

Wolverhampton Advertised Salary

• The advertised median salary for roles over this period in Wolverhampton was £35,875— up by 8.1% from the previous year but 1.2% below the overall national median salary of £36,315.

Top Occupations

- The top posted occupations below account for 13.6% of all job postings in this quarter.
- Teachers are the most in demand occupations, receiving the highest number of postings in the area.
- Positions for Social Care Workers were the most in demand vacancies from the employee perspective, receiving the highest interest in terms of clicks and applicants.
- Maintenance Engineers have the highest location quotient while Science Teachers (Secondary School) have the highest salary.


Skills most requested in postings in Wolverhampton, 01/04/2025 - 30/06/2025

• By volume City of Wolverhampton Council have logged the most job postings, followed by The Graduate Network.



Wolverhampton Total Claimants²

Wolverhampton had 12,430 claimants aged 16 years and over in June 2025, an increase of 245 (+2.0%) claimants from the previous month. Compared to June 2024, claimants in Wolverhampton increased by 80 (+0.6%).


- Out of the 20 wards within Wolverhampton, 17 were above the UK average of 3.1%.
- The wards with the highest number of claimants as a percentage of residents aged 16 years and over were St Peter's at 12.0% followed by Heath Town and Ettingshall at 8.0%.

Wolverhampton Youth Claimants

Wolverhampton had 2,305 youth claimants in June 2025, an increase of 15 (+0.7%) youth claimants since May 2025. When compared to June 2024, the number of youth claimants increased by 65 (+2.9%).

- Challenges remain with youth claimants as all 20 wards in Wolverhampton were above the UK average of 4.3% in June 2025.
- The wards with the highest number of claimants as a percentage of residents aged 16-24 were East Park at 12.8%, Bushbury South & Low Hill at 11.5% and Bilston East at 11.3%.
