July to Sept 2025

Current Job Posting Trends¹

Wolverhampton Overview

- Between July to September 2025 (inclusive), there were 8,578 unique job adverts for roles recorded in Wolverhampton. This number of postings is high compared to all local authority districts. Over the past year, this has decreased by 11.3%, compared to a decrease of 7.0% across the UK.
- During this period, there were 6,365 unique job postings. This number of postings is high compared to all local authority districts. Over the past year, this has decreased by 13.0%, compared to a decrease of 10.8% across the UK.

Demand and Interest Trend:



- Comparing the final week of the quarter with the same week at the start of the quarter, live postings adverts decreased by 3.2% while new job postings decreased by 3.8%, indicating a decline in labour market demand.
- More recent trends show an increase in demand as live postings increased by 11.2% in the last 30 days of job posting activity, new postings also increased by 14.9% showing a strong recovery in labour market demand following a decline at the start of the quarter.
- By comparing interest quotient and demand, we can identify where there are mismatches in talent/supply and demand. Interest Quotient is ranked high at 2.6.

Wolverhampton Advertised Salary

• The advertised median salary for roles over this period in Wolverhampton was £35,320 – up by 3.9% from the previous year but 1.8% below the overall national median salary of £35,976.

Top Occupations

- The top posted occupations below account for 12.8% of all job postings in this quarter.
- Teachers are the most in demand occupations, receiving the highest number of postings in the area.
- Positions for Social Care Worker were the most in demand vacancies from the employee perspective, receiving the highest interest in terms of clicks and applicants.
- Social Care Worker have the highest location quotient while Science Teachers (Secondary School) have the highest salary.


Skills most requested in postings in Wolverhampton, 01/07/2025 - 30/09/2025

• By volume City of Wolverhampton Council have logged the most job postings, followed by The Graduate Network.



Wolverhampton Total Claimants²

 Wolverhampton had 11,810 claimants aged 16 years and over in September 2025, a decrease of 60 (-0.5%) claimants from the previous month. Compared to September 2024, claimants in Wolverhampton decreased by 1,605 (-12.0%).


- Out of the 20 wards within Wolverhampton, 17 were above the UK average of 3.9%.
- The wards with the highest number of claimants as a percentage of residents aged 16 years and over were St Peter's at 12.3% followed by East Park at 9.7% and Ettingshall at 8.9%.

Wolverhampton Youth Claimants

 Wolverhampton had 2,325 youth claimants in September 2025, a decrease of 15 (-0.6%) youth claimants since the previous month. When compared to September 2024, the number of youth claimants decreased by 60 (-2.5%).

- Challenges remain with youth claimants as all 20 wards in Wolverhampton were above the UK average of 4.3% in September 2025.
- The wards with the highest number of claimants as a percentage of residents aged 16-24 were St Peter's at 14.7%, East Park at 12.4% and Graiseley at 9.8%.
